STOCK IDENTIFICATION

Yellowtail amberjack range widely throughout Australian and New Zealand waters. However mitochondrial research indicates that two separate stocks exists in Australian waters (*Miller et al. 2011*) Eastern and Western Yellowtail amberjack. It is suggested that the Eastern stock is also prevalent in New Zealand waters.
